A note from our president

First of all, I want to invite each and every Furry Friends volunteer to our Volunteer Appreciation Dinner on April 30! Furry Friends PATS makes a difference in so many lives each month. We could not provide so much love without you. See Flyer in this newsletter for more info. I look forward to seeing you on April 30!

I am so sad to let you know that Furry Friends is no longer visiting Lucille Packard's Children's Hospital or El Camino Hospital. Furry Friends was not able to sign their new agreement to continue services with them. It's such a shame that they are requiring this agreement with our volunteer organization. Lucille Packard's Children's Hospital was our first team and we have had a very dedicated group of volunteers visiting there for 35 years. Unfortunately their legal team would not discuss this with our attorney.

- The required agreement called for Furry Friends to indemnify LPCH. Furry Friends' Insurance Policy expressly states it will not cover damages Furry Friends is obligated to pay by reason of the assumption of liability in an agreement. And without insurance, we cannot visit.
- The agreement mischaracterized the relationship between LPCH and Furry Friends, seeking to make Furry Friends an independent contractor. Independent contractor status carries large potential liability. Moreover, this inaccurate characterization is far removed from the true nature of the relationship, where Furry Friends is a volunteer, going only to parts of the hospital allowed by LPCH and visiting only patients referred by LPCH. By making us a vendor, the agreement required Furry Friends to provide workers compensation insurance. We would have to cover all of our volunteers at all sites at a cost of thousands of dollars a year. Clearly, we cannot afford to do this.

Furry Friends' board is so sorry this did not work out the way we all hoped it would. An email has been sent to LPCH explaining that Furry Friends cannot sign a written agreement with LPCH, but remains hopeful that LPCH will change its position in the future and Furry Friends will be open to a discussion in the event that happens.

Q I got an email about a volunteer appreciation dinner coming up soon. I am new to Furry Friends, so I'm not sure what this is all about! *A in San Jose*

A I am really glad you asked! Over the years, Furry Friends has held several different kinds of activities designed to bring volunteers together outside of their usual visits. It is a way for our amazing volunteers to meet one another and all get together in one place. We've held potluck picnics and hosted dinners where members can also ask questions of the board of directors, learn about new sites and upcoming special events, and even ask me questions about animal behavior and pet assisted therapy. There is always a free raffle drawing for pet-related items, gift cards, etc. And....there is always really great swag for attendees to take home! This year, there are several take-home gifts for attendees that I am excited about (and had input in choosing as well). You will be receiving more details shortly on the dinner and I hope you will attend. There is always a small fee for the dinner, but this is simply to make sure you have a spot and help the caterers determine how much food to provide. The bulk of the cost for the appreciation dinner will come from Furry Friends itself. And, for anyone who didn't see the email, the dinner is on Monday April 30th!

Q I am on two different Reading Buddies teams with Furry Friends. Over the last year or so, I have noticed fewer kids attending our visits and we seem to be losing volunteers on my teams as well. When I looked at the class calendar for this year, I only see two Reading Buddies classes even being offered. Is Furry Friends phasing out the Reading Buddies program? This was really the main reason I joined Furry Friends, so I'd be very sad to see the program go away. *E in Palo Alto*

A I would really miss this program too if it were to go away! Rest assured, Furry Friends does not intend to discontinue the Reading Buddies program. It is important to keep in mind, however, that volunteer interests do change. The number of classes offered this year reflects that change in interest. More and more volunteers coming into our organization are showing interest in special visits like those we do for stress relief

at local schools and colleges. While we still see interest in the reading programs in schools and libraries, the interest has definitely dropped off over the last couple of years. In addition, more than one library has seen a decreased interest in the program at their site and asked that the visits be discontinued. The program first began almost 10 years ago, so I am not surprised that you have seen the membership on your teams change. Many of the original Reading Buddies members have had their pets get too old to enjoy the program any longer, or had their animals earn their wings and cross the rainbow bridge. As with all of our teams and visits, this program has also seen a fair share of members move out of the area and on to pet assisted therapy in their new home towns. Fear not! I am still actively discussing and promoting this wonderful program and will continue to fill the Reading Buddies teams we have up and running with new volunteers and their pets as they complete the additional training required. If we can generate more interest in the program again, then we can actively pursue additional sites to visit. At this time, however, we are not adding any additional Reading Buddies sites because we just don't have enough qualified volunteers to fill them.

Q **I was flying out of SFO recently and saw a group of people and their pets doing pet assisted therapy work right there in the airport! I would love to be able to do this too. Is this a program that Furry Friends offers? I don't see any airport visits listed on the website.** *R in San Mateo*

A I, too, have seen pet assisted therapy teams in our local airports! While Furry Friends does not have any airport teams, we do have members who visit the local airports as part of other organizations. Furry Friends does not restrict its members from visiting with other groups, so these volunteers are doing their airport visits as part of Love On A Leash and/or Alliance of Therapy Dogs. You can find more information on both of these groups by visiting their websites.

Q **I am asking this question for a friend of mine! She has several really sweet, well-socialized retired show dogs that she'd like to have become Furry Friends. Her question is this: On our website it lists the vaccines that are required in order to do visits and we require the Rabies vaccine. She doesn't give that vaccine to any of her dogs after their 5th birthday. If she can prove that they have immunity via titers, can her dogs become pet assisted therapists with Furry Friends?** *J in Santa Clara*

A State law requires dogs and cats to be vaccinated against rabies, regardless of age and whether or not they are indoor or outdoor pets. Titers cannot be accepted in place of the rabies vaccine, so unfortunately, your friend and her dogs will not be able to join Furry Friends unless she is willing to give them those Rabies vaccines.

Importance of photos at our sites

Since I have been a member of Furry Friends PATS we have always had Polaroid cameras to take pictures of those we visit. I didn't think much about the photos until I started going to Agnews State Hospital before it closed. We were asked to come to expose many of the clients to dogs as many had never been with one and most of the smaller facilities that these people would be moving to would have pets. The first time I went to evaluate the site with my dog Teruu, we took some pictures with some clients, using the Polaroid, and left them with the staff. At our first visit we saw almost 100 clients and took over 200 pictures that we put on tables and the staff gave them to each of the units. We had 8 dogs and 4 additional people that just came to help take pictures. We had one photographer per every 2 dogs. The staff

really enjoyed the pictures. After about 6 months one of the nurses told me a few stories about the importance of the photos that we took. One of the very first pictures I took with Teruu and a patient when we came to evaluate the site was the only picture the family had when the patient died a few months after the picture. A picture of the patient and Teruu was used at his funeral. Many of the staff took the pictures we had taken and mailed them to families that could not come often to see their family members. They all really appreciated them. We were at that site for almost 4 years before it closed.

I have been Captain of Valley Medical Pediatrics for 15+ years... and have also seen how important the pictures are to the kids and families. The kids have a nice happy thought about their visits. Recently one mom kept wanting to have two of the dog's pictures taken with her son. The third month we were there she showed me his progress those three months with the pictures that had been taken with him and the two dogs. The first they just sat next to him, the second he was laying there and patting them, the third he was in a wheelchair and holding one and the other he was hugging. The mom loved our pictures.

At our team, we have one of our members each month dedicated to taking pictures and not bringing their dog to the visit. Many don't think about what that picture means to others, it means a lot.

The new Polaroid camera that some of us have been using can take and print over 50 pictures in a charge. If you need one for your team contact the Admin@furryfriends.com
